TBPA East Section News

East Tennessee Dilemma

It seems the new plumbing code change has started quite a stir in East Tennessee. The only people to know anything about it are the Local 572 in Nashville. No one in East Tennessee has received any information or has a clue about the change.

Several local irrigation personnel and backflow repairmen have contacted the governmental agencies and cannot get any information on the code change. The local Plumbers Union representative stated that he knew there had been some changes made to some of the codes and licenses but was not aware of all of them. The City of Knoxville and the Local Plumbers Union does not offer any certification program other than the block test as master plumbers. If a person takes and passes the block test they would not accept that person unless they also had the required experience with a master plumber.

It seems if a change is to be voted on and passed by the legislature, revisions should be in effect for the contractors to acquire the certification. How can it be justified to cut out people who know what they are doing, and give the backflow work to a plumber that has not seen a backflow preventer?

Containment vs. Isolation Assemblies

The last West Section Newsletter article reviewed an actual medical facility, looking at things that were done properly, as well as things that were done improperly or not done at all. In this article let's continue by looking at assemblies. The medical facility has both "containment" and "isolation" assemblies. Are they both, or either, always necessary?

Naturally, we do not want to waste the developer's money or cause a contractor to lose money. And redundant installations, i.e. installing a containment assembly when isolation will adequately do the job — can be considered overprotection. In many cases, the concept of containment or protection of the public water supply can adequately be handled with the installation of one or two small isolation assemblies that are properly located and installed.

There are times, however, when a containment assembly must be installed at the time of construction — for instance, a strip mall with a single water supply. Because we have no idea what type of tenants will occupy the different spaces, containment is necessary. And it is particularly necessary with a hospital or medical center.

The Need for Proper RPBP Location

Moving forward in our survey of the medical facility, we

find a 2-inch water supply, also located in the boiler room, for the cooling towers located outside of the building. Neatly installed is a 2-inch RPBP located in the ceiling between all the pipes and ductwork. Although the protection is proper, location is pitiful. Why? It is at least 10 feet up in the air and would take a contortionist to get to it for testing or repair maintenance. RPBP maintenance should be scheduled at least annually to ensure that all assemblies are working property. This maintenance is the reason why the assembly must be relocated to a lower, more easily accessible location.

Remember, take a closer look at all medical facilities to discover how well its backflow prevention has been designed and implemented. Next month we will go deeper into the other potential problem areas.


Meet the Newest TBPA Board Member


