East Tennessee News

Hello Everyone!

I hope everyone had a great winter. I am sure glad spring is here! This is a crazy time for everyone with the uncertainty that comes with this virus, but I really think we will get through this together. To ALL of us who are out and still are testing backflow assemblies, please prioritize your safety and the safety of family and friends you come into contact with by keeping your hands clean and away from your faces. During this time, please keep those who have lost someone due to this pandemic and the people in Middle Tennessee who have suffered from the treacherous weather in your thoughts and prayers!

I have already had someone call to have her irrigation system turned on for the year. Last fall when I blew out her system and drained the water from the backflow assembly, I left the backflow in good shape! I had both shutoff valves and the 4 test cocks turned at a 45-degree angle so no water would be trapped in either the valves or test cocks. This year when I went back to turn the system on, someone had turned the shutoff valves back on, turned the test cocks off, and had loosened the 4 bolts on the relief valve cover to about 5 threads on each bolt. Thankfully the valves and test cocks were fine, but unfortunately the same could not be said for the relief valve. The assembly sits under some trees, which means that it is exposed to things falling from the trees along with everyday dirt buildup. The brass on the cover and where it bolts on to the assembly had so much buildup that I struggled to get it clean with a wet rag. The diaphragm was just as dirty and had a little tear on it. Once I cleaned it all up and turned it on, I noticed that it sprayed from the side. After many times taking it apart, cleaning it, and putting it all back together, it still leaked! I then tried putting a new diaphragm in. No change. I finally looked at the cover and noticed a small pit hole in the brass. I thought surely that small hole would not make it spray like it was! I had a new assembly in my truck and decided to put it on, and thankfully it stopped leaking! The lady felt so bad for all the trouble I was going through that she made me a sandwich! While I was there, a neighbor came over and we started talking about how some people can't mow a yard, but they think they can master a backflow assembly! This goes hand in hand with my article from a past newsletter which showed the proper use of the OEM. I'm sure whoever worked on her assembly was just trying to be helpful, but be aware of these things when when going to residences and try to educate where possible.

Also, last year I had told a business that the box they had over their backflow was in bad shape and they needed to do something before it froze. Here is what they did!
