East Tennessee News

I hope everyone has had a good and safe winter and is ready for spring because I sure am! Soon everyone will be wanting the irrigation systems turned on for the year. I have already had to replace one backflow device because they thought it had been winterized and it was not. Also, I have already had a call to turn the irrigation on for the year and I had to explained to the person what could happen if it turned cold again just for a few days and nights. I know they make a freeze prevention valve that you can put on the backflow assembly that is in the price range of \$60.00- \$90.00 but I have never seen one out in the field. If anyone has seen one on a backflow assembly, let me know what you think about it.

In regards to other backflow topics, I had a city official contact me about the city putting in a splash pad and if it needed a backflow assembly. I told them the following story. When I was working at a water utility, the county had a park with a splash pad. All of a sudden, kids were getting sick with e-coli and going to doctors, the E.R., etc. The health department got involved and they traced it back to that splash pad. The county called me and asked me if the splash pad backflow assembly had been tested and it had been. We had the latest test report and we had another test done after they called me and it passed! Also, another backflow assembly was just after the water meter so we had the containment and isolation devices and they both had been tested each year. They had been treating the water each day with chemicals but all it took was a kid with a diaper on in the splash pad. If you think about it, this is what the hazards are with recycled water even though they are equipped with chemicals and filters. This goes to show everyone that even though everyone was doing their job, freak accidents can still happen. I have someone every couple weeks tell me that backflow is crazy, that it never happens and it is just a bunch of bull (and I am sure we all have heard it said more differently than that!). People question whether we really need backflow assemblies. When I tell them the splash pad story, they understand the purpose of them. So again, just slow down and educate the public about what we do, which is protect the public drinking water.

We all do this for a living and we see and hear things first hand. Lets pass it on and learn from each other to keep our water safe. Recently, I received a picture from a member about my winter newsletter about wye strainers. It shocked me when I saw it. The picture, which is included with this article, is two different wye strainers on a dual installation. Thanks for the picture and if anyone has any pictures of anything they see that is crazy you can send it to me and I will put them in the newsletter! Lets share and learn from each other!

The TBPA is having a board meeting in April to discuss about having our conference in October so keep watching on the TBPA website and facebook for more info. Today I wanted to talk about backflow assembly selection and installation. Selecting the right backflow assembly for many people can be a tough and costly task. Ensuring your installation is correct with the appropriate model and size assembly for the application and its use(s) is very important. There is nothing more aggravating than having to budget for unneeded service calls and/or repairs, due to an undersized/oversized assembly.

Always consult an expert when choosing a model and size especially if you are unfamiliar with what may be needed. Taking the cheapest route could cost you in the long run.

Making the correct device choice on the front end along with the appropriate installation based on individual needs can save time/money over the long term life of your assembly.

Contact your local area backflow sales representative for specs and flow ratings for specific size and model assemblies to suit your application.

Hello everyone,

I hope that this article finds you all well. I wanted to share an observation I made this year during the pandemic. What I noticed was there seems to be another advantage of having the backflow devices installed outside of a commercial customer's building and, yes, in some type of weather/security type protective covering. This year, while many buildings were closed or only allowing limited access it was comforting to know that you did not have to go inside the building to test the backflow devices. We have all had that high-risk high hazard company where the backflow devices are installed at the curb line and you were very happy you didn't have to venture into the building.

It's also a good feeling when you see that the POE (point of entry) RPZ behind this water meter is truly installed before any branches in the service. I can't see underground or through walls yet, so I do get a little nervous when I see that my POE (point of entry) is installed way back on the property in some back of the building broom closet.

As a representative of the water company or as the state book says, water purveyor, should we have all our commercial customers be required to have their backflow protection for domestic and fire be located outside at the curb line?
