East Tennessee News

I hope everyone had a great spring! Wow, didn't we get the summer heat in a hurry? Onceagain, I will not be doing a repair class this fall. I know covid has slowed down but I wanteveryone to feel 100% comfortable and would hate for anyone to chance getting covid and/or possibly taking it home to loved ones. Hopefully, we can have a class in 2022.

I have ran into a few things in the past couple weeks that I thought should be brought to everyone's attention. Recently, I had to do some repairs and the homeowners told me what they were told was wrong with the backflow devices. I thought it best to test them myself before I repaired them. One backflow device I was told failed because the #2 shutoff did not hold. However, when I tested it, the #1 leaked check leaked down and the #2 shutoff held tight. If I would have put a new shutoff valve on, it would have been a more expensive repair that was not needed. I was told the other backflow device failed because the #2 check valve leaked on back pressure. When I tested it, the #2 check valve did leak on back pressure but, also the #1 check valve leaked down on the setup. I am SURE I have made mistakes, as we are all human, but I try to double check myself when I do fail one. I hear from time to time how many backflow devices people test a day. This is a good reminder that it is not a race of how many you can test in a day. It is a service you provide to make sure the potable water is safe for everyone to drink.

Another issue that I ran into is the isolation and containment installations. We all know the height is 12" - 60" from floor to center line of the assembly and I ran into a new install on a few isolation assemblies that were 10-12 ft. Since it is an isolation device, the utility does not want to get involved with this issue since they do not test them. (Reach out to the local utility and see if they will get involved first though.) Then this becomes an issue between the tester, plumber and whomever owns the building. So even if you are one who doesn't test the isolation backflow devices, you need to make everyone aware of the height issue because someone will end up on a ladder testing it!

I hope everyone can get out and enjoy the summer with your family and friends this year! Stay safe!!

Please remember your TDEC Cross Connection testing/evaluation certificate of backflow devices has to be renewed every 3 years.
