East Tennessee News

Hello Everyone,

I hope everyone had a great spring and it is hard to believe that summer is almost here. For me it seems days, weeks and months just go so fast anymore. Dave Birkholtz sent me a email that Rich Koenig had passed away on May 16th. Rich was active in the APBA for many years, and he was the region 12 director for ABPA . Keep Rich family and friends in your thoughts and prayers.

A few months ago, I had to go retest a Wilkins 975XL2 3/4" backflow assembly that had failed. The maintenance guy did the repair and when I retested it the relief valve opened at 2.5 and the #1 check valve held at 7.1 and yes it did meet the 3-pound buffer and I just made a comment about with the new check rubber I would have thought it would have been higher and he said he had put the disc holder and spring in also from the kit. We talked about it and ended up taking the first check out and I looked and nothing on the rubber, but I did notice the stem on the disc holder was kind of rough like sandpaper or something had been used on it and he said he just got it out of the bag and put it in. I put it back together and it tested the same and we talked about why it was so low and he went got the kit his boss ordered and it was in a different package that what they come in and the instructions were different but it

did say Wilkins on the instructions so I ask where they bought it and they said amazon so I looked it up and you can get everything seats springs disc holder relief valve module and rubbers for \$50.50. So, I knew something was right then. It did not have a Wilkins bar code on it so all I did was take the check rubber off and replaced it with a Wilkins check rubber and the reading was higher so then we replaced the spring and disc holder and the #1 check went to 9.3. As I have wrote in newsletters before about using the original parts from the manufacture that you are working on, they thought that they had bought original parts and honestly if I would have just said it meets the 3-pound buffer and went on, I would have never known about this NOT Wilkins kit.

With me telling this about the kit we all need to remember we are doing a job to protect our drinking water, and someone is paying us for a service, and it should be done the best of our ability and not thinking it passed or my goodness it is quitting time or trying to see how many we can test a day. That slowed me down an hour but that was ok because I learned something, and I caught something that could have gone bad and worst-case scenario got back in the drinking water and people have got sick or worse.

Backflow Assembly Selection and Installation

Selecting the right backflow assembly for many people can be a daunting and costly task. Ensuring your installation is correct with the appropriate model and size assembly for the application and its use(s) is very important. There is nothing more aggravating than having to budget for unjust service calls and or repairs, due to an undersized or oversized assembly.

Always consult an expert when choosing a model & size especially if you are unfamiliar with what may be needed. Taking the cheapest route will usually cost you in the long run. Making the correct device choice on the front end along with the appropriate installation based on individual needs can save money long term over the life of your assembly.

Contact your area backflow sales representative for specs and flows for specific size and model assemblies to best suit your application.
